# Persian New Year Norooz

Norooz means "new day", marking the first day of the Persian Calendar year and the first day of Spring. The most important holiday in Iran, this celebration lasts two weeks, with a pre-party called "Chahar Shanbeh Soori", then setting the "Haft Seen", New Year's Table, and finally,

a day outdoors or "Sizdah Bedar" to button up the festivities. With the season's change and the rejuvenation of Mother Earth, we usher in forgiveness, reflection, renewal, growth and well wishes for family members as they gather to celebrate together.





### Chahar Shanbeh Soori

On the eve of the Wednesday before Norooz, families gather to jump over fire and say goodbye to the past and bring in new energy and light. On this night, you can light candles, admire bonfires or jump over your own fire, letting go of the past and asking the flames for energy and light. As you jump, you say to the fire, "Zardiye man az to, sorkhiye to az man" meaning, "Take my yellow tiredness and give me your red energy."

In preparation for Norooz, Iranians clean their house (Khooneh Takooni) and shop for new clothes. They then prepare the seven "s"s for the Haft Seen, which may include growing Sabzeh (sprouts), coloring eggs, and making sweets.






# Wish someone a Happy Norooz
